# **Dental Check up Camp**

Department of Business Administration

offer essential dental health education to the people
and motivate them to maintain good dental hygiene.

About 65 members of Muthukalipatti village participated in this dental check up camp, and they were educated and motivated with regards to hygienic maintenance. A few of the patients were referred by the doctor for further treatment. The volunteers played a vital role in making this camp a success with their dedication, and they guided people in the right direction.

# Tree Plantation & Skill Development Program

05.01.23

Realizing the prime need for creating a green environment, students and the faculty of the department of textile and fashion design developed a keen interest In planting the saplings in the ground of the government higher secondary school. About twenty saplings



of varied plants have been planted. It has been decided to keep in frequent touch with the authorities to keep us updated on the rearing of saplings.

Chemistry department organized extension activity on "Micro Scale Techniques in Organic Analysis" for the benefit of the Students at Higher Secondary Government Boys School, NamagiriPettai, Rasipuram. Traditionally, experiments in Organic Chemistry are carried out on a **Macroscale** level, employing quantities chemicals on the order of 5-100 g, using glassware designed to contain between 25 and 500 mL of liquids.

For quantities of materials in the 0.005-0.5 gram range, one employs different, "Microscale" techniques and glassware in order to carry out the various standard organic laboratory operations. In the following, the student is introduced to the special equipment used in micro scale experiments, as well as the somewhat different methods which are used. About 51 Students benefitted in this Micro Scale techniques in Organic analysis. This technique helps to maintain pollution-free environment, cut costs on chemistry laboratory and to reduce chemical wastes.
